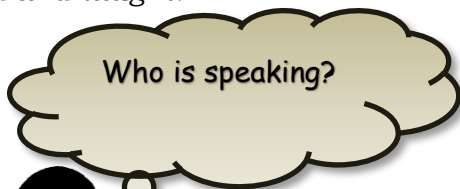
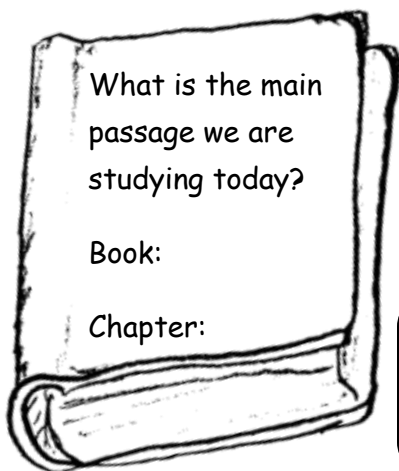

Jacob Wrestles with God – Monday

- Say the memory verse to mom, dad, or older sibling.

Pray: Dear Father, help me to understand what I read in Your Word.

Read: *Genesis 32:1-2*

Jacob had taken Esau's birthright and then stole the blessing from him, too. Esau wanted to kill Jacob, so Rebekah sent Jacob away. Traveling to stay with one of Rebekah's relatives, Jacob slept outside with his head upon a rock. That night, God sent him a dream in which Jacob saw a ladder going right up into heaven, with angels on it! Jacob worshipped the LORD calling this place, Bethel, meaning, 'the house of God.'

Jacob was gone for 20 years! He married and had many children. He decided to set off for "home."

Pray

Dear LORD God, You chose Jacob. You bring events and people into their lives to change them into the kind of people that are pleasing to You. Thank You for loving me and changing me to be like Jesus.

Draw a picture of what Jacob saw as he camped out in the wilderness (verse 1).

Application

God gave His Son to die for sins and raised Him from the dead to give forgiveness and eternal life to all who believe in Him. He also shows His love by changing us to be like Jesus. Jacob Wrestles with God – Tuesday

- Say the memory verse to mom, dad, or older sibling.

Pray: Dear Father, help me to understand what I read in Your Word.

Read: Genesis 32:3-5

Jacob was nervous. Rebekah had never told him it was okay to return. Jacob knew Esau might still be angry.

Pray

Dear LORD God,

Your word tells us that
*"A gift in secret averts
anger, and a concealed
bribe, strong wrath"*
(Proverbs 21:14).

You change hearts.
Teach me to come to You
when I am afraid of
others and to rely on
Your power to change
hearts.

Jacob Wrestles with God – Wednesday

- Say the memory verse to mom, dad, or older sibling.

Pray: Dear Father, help me to understand what I read in Your Word.

Read: *Genesis 32:6-9*

Dear LORD God, when I am afraid, I must put my trust in You. You alone can help! You are faithful. I know You will hear me when I cry out to You.

Application

- Say the memory verse to mom, dad, or older sibling.

Pray: Dear Father, help me to understand what I read in Your Word.

Read: *Genesis 32:9-12*

Jacob was afraid, and so he prayed.

Dear LORD God, You
always keep Your Word!
Even though none of us is
worthy of Your love and
goodness, You are
faithful to every promise
You make to us. I praise
You for this!

Application

Jacob threw himself on
God's mercy. He knew
that God keeps His
promises. Jacob prays
those promises back to
God. He admits his lack
of worthiness and pleads
to the LORD for help.

Notice what Jacob prayed and

- Say the memory verse to mom, dad, or older sibling.

Pray: Dear Father, help me to understand what I read in Your Word.

Read: *Genesis 32:22-29*

Jacob sent gifts and then separated himself from his family and men. That night, Jacob had an encounter with the LORD that would forever change him.

Pray

Dear LORD God, You are the ruler of Your people. We must submit to Your will for us and live life Your way. Teach me to deny myself, take up my cross, and truly follow You today and every day.

What happened that night under the stars? (You may draw it or write about it.)

After that night, God renamed Jacob. What was his new name?

Application

Jacob had to be "broken" physically before he would finally and forever submit to God. You and I must also learn to yield to God and His ways for us.

Ask a parent to help you think of one way you need to yield your life to God and write it down. Do you talk back to your parents? Fail to obey them all the way, right away, and in a happy way? Are you putting games before quiet time with God?

Pray and ask God to "break" this attitude, action, or inaction from your life.

Jacob Wrestles with God – Saturday

- Say the memory verse to mom, dad, or older sibling.

Pray: Dear Father, help me to understand what I read in Your Word.

Read: *Genesis 33:1-4*

Humbled and depending on God alone, Jacob goes out to meet Esau.

Pray

Dear LORD God, all things are possible with You. You bring blessings into the lives of Your people so that even our enemies live at peace with us. When I am having trouble with people, help me to remember Jacob and Esau and seek Your face in prayer, first!

What happens when Esau and Jacob meet? You may draw it or write about it.

Application

How happy Jacob must have been to see his brother and to be welcomed home by him. God restored their relationship. God does what people cannot!
