Israel Rejects God as King - Monday

Say the memory verse to mom, dad, or older sibling.

Pray: Dear Father, help me to understand what I read in Your Word.

Read: 1 Samuel 8:1-9, 19-20

Samuel was a good judge, but his sons were not. Also, the people did not trust God to lead them, judge them, or fight their battles. They rejected the LORD as king and demanded that Samuel give them a king.

In <i>verses 10-18</i> , Samuel tells the people that having a king will be difficult for them. How do the people respond? (v. 19)							

Read *Psalms 22:28* and *Proverbs 21:1*. Even though many nations had kings (and have presidents and other kinds of leaders to this day), whom is actually the King of all kings?

Application:

We often want things that may be bad for us. It's sometimes hard to believe that your parents may know what is best for you. However, you may be given what you want, only to see that they were right.

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Israel Rejects God as King - Tuesday

Say the memory verse to mom, dad, or older sibling.

Pray: Dear Father, help me to understand what I read in Your Word.

Read: 1 Samuel 9:1-6, 15-16, 27

The LORD chooses a man to be the king of Israel. He is everything the people will want. He comes from a wealthy family, is tall and handsome. But, will these things make Saul a good king?

1. Saul's father lost some of his donkeys. Saul, along with one of the servants, had gone to look for them. Who does the servant suggest they go see? (v.6)

God used the lost donkeys to bring Saul to Samuel, who is waiting for him to arrive.

God brought Saul to this place so that Samuel could anoint him "prince of God's people Israel and save them from the hand of the Philistines".

Application:

God is sovereign, which means He is in control of the world He made and carries out His will to fulfill His purposes. He sets up kings and presidents, and He removes kings and presidents according to His plan.

God has shown us in His Word how we are to behave toward the rulers He has placed over us in *Romans 13:1-7*. Even though rulers don't seek to honor God as King, the church is still called to submit to government rulers.

However, there is a time when the church is told to disobey its rulers... when obeying them means disobeying God.

Israel Rejects God as King - Wednesday

Israel Rejects God as King - Thursday

Say the memory verse to mom, dad, or older sibling.

Pray: Dear Father, help me to understand what I read in Your Word.

Read: 1 Samuel 11:1-15

Nahash, the Ammonite, attacks an Israelite city, Jabesh-Gilead. Hoping to avoid a battle, the people offer to make a treaty, but Nahash will only agree if they let him mutilate and humiliate them by gouging out their right eyes. The people, in desperation, send for help.

Israel Rejects God as King - Friday

Say the memory verse to mom, dad, or older sibling.

Pray: Dear Father, help me to understand what I read in Your Word.

Read: 1 Samuel 12:1-19

Samuel is old but he is still the spiritual leader. He needs Israel to see that they did wrong in rejecting the LORD as king. He will challenge them to see that their motives were sinful, and call them to repentance.

Can the people point to anything Samuel ever did that was wrong or self-serving (vv 3-5)?								
In <i>verses 6-12</i> , Samuel recalls times when the LORD God had saved His people. Yet, time and again they had turned against him. In <i>verse 12</i> , who should the people have turned to when Nahash attacked the city of Jabesh-Gilead?								
Israel rejected God as their king over and over, but by His grace, He had now given them the "king" for which they had asked. Nevertheless, the Israelites would still have to follow God.								
"If you will f the LORD and s him and o his voice and not r against the commandment of the LORD, and if both y and the k who reigns over you will f the LORD your God, it will be well" (verse 14). Yet, if they rebelled against the LORD, there would be no one to save them from God's wrath. The sign of the thunder & rain caused the people to fear, and to cry out for prayer. Confessing their sin, the people repented of having rejected God as their king.

Israel Rejects God as King - Saturday

Say the memory verse to mom, dad, or older sibling.

Pray: Dear Father, help me to understand what I read in Your Word.

Read: 1 Samuel 12:20-25

Since the Exodus, the LORD God had been the king over Israel. He defeated their enemies, provided for their needs, gave them a good land, and called men to oversee them.

In spite of their sinful ways, each time they called upon the name of the LORD for deliverance from their enemies, the LORD graciously rescued them. Through Moses, Joshua, the judges and prophets, the LORD had more than been a "good king". He had been a perfect King!
