



Saul Disobeys God - Monday

> Say the memory verse to mom, dad, or older sibling.

Pray: Dear Father, help me to understand what I read in Your Word.

Read: 1 Samuel 13:1-7

As king, Saul went on from his victory over Nahash the Ammonite to fight Israel's enemy, the Philistines.

Saul sends messengers out with trumpets to announce his victory over Philistine soldiers, but who had really fought and won that battle (v 3)?

Why would Saul want everyone to think he won this battle?

Did this bring glory to God or to Saul? _____

Discuss with a parent: Was it wrong for the king to take the credit? ____ Why, or why not? _____

The Philistines came back with more troops and weapons. They were ready to attack. How did the Israelites respond (vv 6-7)?

Application:

Israel was still afraid of the Philistines because they were thinking about how many Philistine soldiers there were. Israel was not thinking about how powerful God is. Israel was trusting in the power and faithfulness of man, and when it didn't look like man was powerful and faithful enough to protect them, they were terribly afraid.

Are you ever afraid? Your fear starts in the same place that Israel's fear started. When you are afraid, you are only thinking about what you, or someone else, can do to protect and help you. Thinking about God, how loving, powerful and faithful He is, will bring you peace instead of fear. What is something that makes you anxious, worried, or afraid?

Does God know this about you? Yes or NO Is God more powerful than this? Yes or No Ask God to help you remember His faithful care.

Saul Disobeys God - Tuesday

> Say the memory verse to mom, dad, or older sibling.

Pray: Dear Father, help me to understand what I read in Your Word.

Read: 1 Samuel 13:8-12

Read *1 Samuel 10:8*. Where and for how long was Saul supposed to wait for Samuel?

Did Saul wait for Samuel as commanded (13:8-9)? _____

Who showed up as soon as Saul finished making the burnt offering (v 10)?

Saul had disobeyed the command of the LORD, but he did not want to take the blame (vv 11-12). What excuses did Saul give to Samuel for his act of disobeying God? ______

Saul made a sacrifice like Samuel was going to do, but his reason for making the sacrifice was neither to worship God nor to truly seek God's help and guidance in winning the battle against the Philistines.

Application:

Saul did not trust the LORD, and his disobedience proved it. Lack of faith is always shown by a person's disobedience. When we disobey, we are saying with our actions that we do not trust God in that area of our lives. Have you ever disobeyed and thought that it wasn't a big deal? Which is obedience?

Saul Disobeys God - Wednesday

> Say the memory verse to mom, dad, or older sibling.

Pray: Dear Father, help me to understand what I read in Your Word.

Read: 1 Samuel 13:13-15

Samuel is very upset, and tells Saul *"You have done f______(v 13)* Then, Samuel gives Saul the bad news about his kingdom. What was the bad news (*vv 13-14*)? ______

Verse 14 tells us that God has already picked out a new king to replace Saul. What is special about the man of God's own choosing (*v 14*)?


Saul looked like he would be the perfect king for Israel. He was tall, handsome, and his father was wealthy. But in the end, Saul's heart was not devoted to the LORD. When trouble came, Saul showed what was really in his heart. He would do whatever it took to make himself look good.

Application:

Saul had disobeyed God. Samuel told Saul that he would have a consequence. A consequence is something that happens because of something you do. Because Saul didn't obey God, his family would no longer be kings. God had to show Saul and Israel that it is important to obey God in their hearts as well as in their actions.

Saul Disobeys God - Thursday

Say the memory verse to mom, dad, or older sibling.

Pray: Dear Father, help me to understand what I read in Your Word.

Read: 1 Samuel 15:1-11

Samuel comes to Saul, even though he has not obeyed, and gives him another chance to do what God commanded. Would Saul finally obey the LORD (*VV* 3, 9)? _____

What group of people did the LORD tell Saul to devote to destruction (vv 1-3)?

Read Exodus 17:7-16. When had Amalek attacked Israel in the past? ____

The LORD God had declared in the days of Moses that He would wipe out the memory of the Amalekites, forever. Saul was to be God's chosen person to bring about the LORD's punishment. What was Saul to *"spare"* or save after the battle (v 3)?

Saul Disobeys God - Friday

> Say the memory verse to mom, dad, or older sibling.

Pray: Dear Father, help me to understand what I read in Your Word.

Read: 1 Samuel 15:12-23

What had Saul made for himself (v 12)?

What does Saul say he has done in verse 13?

Was this true? _____



Samuel answers Saul with a question? What is Samuel's question (v 14)?

Saul basically said, *"I did it! I obeyed the LORD!"* Samuel knew better. Samuel could see all the animals Saul had NOT devoted to the LORD. Samuel points to the *"spoil"* and asks *"Why...did you not obey the voice of the LORD?"* Does Saul now admit that he has sinned (v 20)?

Whom does he blame for not obeying the LORD (v 21)? _____

Repentance is to have a change of heart and mind so that we see our sin the way God sees it and purpose to change. Has Saul repented of his sin of disobedience? _____ Saul rebelled against the LORD and did what he thought would be better than God's plan. Saul rejected the LORD as his God, so now, the LORD rejected Saul as king.

Application:

Who knows what is the best for you to do? God OR You How can you know everything that God wants you to love and do?

Your own thoughts and ideas OR By reading the Bible

When you do what is different from what the Bible tells you to do, you are saying that you want to do YOUR plans instead of God's plans. God desires your total obedience, which you cannot do on your own. You must ask Him in faith to change your heart that you might obey Him in all you do and say.

Saul Disobeys God - Saturday

> Say the memory verse to mom, dad, or older sibling.

Pray: Dear Father, help me to understand what I read in Your Word.

Read: 1 Samuel 15:24-31, 35

The people had rejected God and demanded that Samuel "give them a king like all the other nations." In spite of God's warnings about what a king would cost them, the people did not repent until the LORD thundered and rained from heaven to show them His wrath (1 Samuel 12:16:19).

Israel had been given what they wanted. Saul was king. They would soon live to regret having their requests for Saul. Unlike the LORD their God, Saul was a very selfish and bad king.

You've learned this week:

- The King begins to disobey the LORD (1 Samuel 13:1-12).
- The LORD tells Saul, "Your kingdom shall not continue," (1 Samuel 13:13-14).
- The LORD rejects Saul as king because he refuses to repent of his sinful ways (1 Samuel 15:1-34).

Application:

Saul only asked for forgiveness when he received his consequence. Saul was not sad that he disobeyed God but rather that he was no longer going to be king. Saul thought it was no big deal to disobey God, and he made excuses and lied about his disobedience.

Do you ever disobey and then lie about it? Do you ever make excuses for why you disobey? God wants you to be honest when you disobey. When we ask God to forgive us from our heart, He DOES forgive!

Remember 1 John 1:9 – If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

Do you make excuses when you don't obey? YES NO

Ask God to change your heart to hate sin and love obedience. Ask God to help you to be honest about your sin and to obey God instead.
